Students are familiar with various theological approaches that focus on the respective social, cultural, historical and political context. Against the backdrop of central themes, questions and methods of Intercultural Theology (colonialism/postcolonialism, nativism, public theology, queer theology, gender equality, ecumenics, theology of religions, etc.) and of recent and classical theological concepts with an intercultural perspective, they reflect on the embeddedness of theological thinking and theological speech into particular environments.

They acquire the ability to:

- provide information on how theology is shaped by people's lifeworlds and how it can respond to specific social challenges,
- analyse and discuss complex issues related to the contextuality of theology in an interdisciplinary manner,
- theologically reflect on specific topics in relation to cultural, social, religious and lifeworld contexts,
